

CAFETERIA CHARGE POLICY

The Gibsonburg Board of Education has approved a Lunch/Breakfast Charge Policy that will take effect March 1, 2017. The new policy reads as follows:

“The Board of Education is committed to providing an appropriate nutritional program to all children within Gibsonburg Exempted Village Schools in accordance with applicable state and Federal laws, rules, and regulations.”

Charging a meal is a courtesy extended to our children in the event they forget or lose their lunch money. Due to increased cost of operations, charges shall be limited in number to students.

Students in the elementary will be permitted to charge three (3) breakfasts and three (3) lunches. When these limits are reached an alternative lunch will be provided to the students.

Students in the middle school/high school will be permitted to charge two (2) breakfasts and two (2) lunches. When these limits are reached an alternative lunch will be provided to the students.”

When an elementary student has a low balance or needs to charge a meal a note is sent home or a phone call is made to the parents. High school and middle school students are told when their balance is low or have zero/negative balance and need more money on their account. Phone calls are also made when students have reached their charge limit.

Parents can send in a check or cash with their child any day of the week. Our cashiers are in the kitchens each morning for breakfast and students can make a deposit on their account as soon as they arrive.

Parents can use the online payment system to deposit money in their child’s account by using PayForIt available on the school website at www.gibsonburg.k12.oh.us. Parents can also check their child’s account balance on this system and set up an email to be sent when it reaches a low balance.
